- C. Budget/Finance Committee Mr. Steve Cameron, committee chair, presented the following recommendations from the Committee to the Trustees for their approval:
 - 1. To approve the following recommended Tuition and Fees for the 2016-17 Academic Year.
 - Increase the Technology fee by \$1 per credit hour, from the current \$9 to \$10.
 - Increase the Student Support Fee by \$3 per credit hour, from the current \$1 to \$4.
 - Change the name of the Assessment Fee to the Academic Support Fee and increase the fee by \$5 per student, per semester, from the current \$25 to \$30. Cardin. Board approved.
 - 2. To approve the recommendation to outsource the college's janitorial services with EJ's Cleaning Services, Inc., headquartered in Little Rock at \$268,800 per year. Additional contracted time for weekend work at the Conference Center would be at a \$12 per hour rate. Savings to the college is anticipated to be approximately \$100,000 per year. Sinclair. A. March Monthly Statements

March 2016 highlights included total unrestricted revenue of \$10,775,895.20 which is 77.42% of the total budget of \$13,919,120.16. Total unrestricted expense of \$9,979,583.61 was 71.70% of the total budget of \$13,919,120.16. Total revenues over expenditures at March31, 2016 was \$796,311.59. Total cash and investments at March 31, 2016 was \$6,233,312.76.

A. Administrative Reports

Vice President for Finance and Administration – Mr. Carey Tucker

1. The Conference Center elevator repairs from the power surge damage in February have been completed.

- 2. The lighting project coordinated by the city has gone out for bid.
- 3. The FY 2014-15 Audit exit preliminary report was received.
- 4. The budget has been established in Jenzabar.
- 5. Human Resources staff attended meetings with representatives from the consortium's insurance broker to review an automated enrollment system.
- 6. Physical Plant staff met with Arkansas Energy Office approved vendors for potential performance contracts for energy upgrades and savings.
- 7. The house at 413 Block has been demolished.
- 8. A new RFP has been issued for a federal grant writer.

Vice President for Learning – Dr. Mickey Best

Health & Natural Sciences:

- 1. SouthArk's Respiratory Therapy program is in progress of completing self-study for CoARC (May 1st)
- 2. EMS: The Community Paramedic (Certificate of Proficiency) Program has been approved through SouthArk's Curriculum committee and the Academic Affairs Council. It will be submitted to ADHE on April 22nd.
- 3. Nursing: In response to the question from last month's Board meeting:
 - a. The SouthArk ARNEC (LPN-to-RN program) started with 32 students and graduated 31 (retention 96.87%); the PN programs combined started with 72 students and graduated 58 (retention 80.55%).
 - b. The PN Day program (December graduating class) has a <u>100%</u> NCLEX-PN final pass rate.
 - c. The Evening PN program (December graduating class) has a <u>94.7%</u> NCLEX-PN final pass rate.

Liberal Arts:

- 1. The Arts in April emphasis this year includes: 1) a nature writing workshop entitled "Writing Nature: Real Words from the Real World" Thursday evenings April 7th through May 26th; 2) two performances of Gilbert & Sullivan's "The Pirates of Penzance" 7:00 p.m. at the South Arkansas Arts Center on April 22nd & 23rd presented by the SouthArk Choral Society; 3) the 19th annual Writers' Ink Awards Ceremony, April 24th; 4) a student music recital on April 26th; 5) the annual SouthArk Student Art Exhibit and Sale on April 25th-28th in the conference center; and 6) an art exhibit in the Library from the Library's permanent art collection, including works from photography students.
- 2. On Thursday, April 7th, twenty-four new members were inducted into the Alpha Gamma Iota Chapter of Phi Theta Kappa. Dean Ballard gave an overview of the history of Phi Theta Kappa.

Library:

1. The annual print and electronic book inventory has been completed with 35,461 volumes and 6,076 ebooks.

Vice President for Student Services – Dr. Jim Bullock

Career Pathways Initiative Grant Program

1. A recent College Count\$ report has been released which shows that low-income students who have participated in the Arkansas Career Pathways Initiative in Arkansas reach academic **success** by earning associate degrees or technical certificates at more than double the rate of the general community college population in Arkansas. Fifty-two percent of students who participated in the CPI program from 2006 to 2013 have completed at least one associate degree or technical certificate, compared to only 24 percent of general non-CPI community college students from across Arkansas enrolled in those same academic years.

2. SouthArk's total CPI enrollment is 84, including 33 new students, a 27% increase from FY 2015.

Carl D. Perkins Grant Program

Ms. Shondranise (Nickie) Wright is the new Perkins program advisor. She has a broad background in delivering social services, most recently at Northeast Delta Human Services Authority in Bastrop, LA, where she was a Professional Counselor and acting manager.

NEG/ASP Grant Program

One of the tools that the grant has made possible is the Career Services Management System (College Central). This system will allow for students, staff, and industry partners to communicate regarding job opportunities and student resumes and portfolios, and allow for further staff/student connection and training.

The Testing and Learning Center (TLC)

- SouthArk has responded to the announced elimination of the COMPASS placement test by deciding to use the similar Accuplacer Test beginning after the Fall 2016 semester begins.
- 2. The Testing Center reports that a total of 40 faculty and adjunct faculty are using the Testing Center during the Spring 2016 semester.

<u>Chief Information Officer – Dr. Tim Kirk</u>

Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) upgrade

1. SouthArk went live on Jenzabar EX on April 1, 2016.

Network / Data Center Upgrades

- 1. Project planning for data center upgrade is under final review by Dell engineers.
- 2. Project planning to retire Novell next year is ongoing.
- 3. Project planning for Windows 10 rollout has begun.

Emergency Alert

- 1. The recent inclement weather prompted use of SouthArk's Emergency Notification System. Text messages, desktop notices, interior beacons and the external public address system were activated.
- 2. IT staff are working with the vendor to implement NOAA polygon notification for automatic alerts. This will automatically activate alerts when necessary.

Community Education

- 1. Co-hosting a local Becoming an Outdoors Woman (BOW) workshop with the Arkansas Game and Fish Commission on April 22nd & 23rd at the Welcome Center.
- 2. Registration for Camp Lotsafun: Safari is underway
- 3. Working with the Arkansas Women's Business Center on a possible week long youth entrepreneurship camp in July. Details to come.

Corporate Education

- 1. Donald Lee visited with Bossier Parish Community College and Arkansas Northeastern College to learn about their manufacturing programs.
- 2. Warren summer classes start May 6th.

ACAP

- 1. Received \$1,000 grant from the Union County Community Foundation for student curriculum.
- 2. Received approval to be a CTP program which will allow students to apply for federal financial aid.
- 3. Graduation is set for Thursday, May 12th at the Workforce Development building at 6 pm.

4. As part of their Community Awareness course, students are building "Buddy Benches" out of pallets for Parkers Chapel School District.

Institutional Effectiveness

- 1. The college has completed its annual submissions to the Integrated Post-Secondary Educational Data System (IPEDS) as well as Annual Institutional Data Update to the Higher Learning Commission.
- 2. SouthArk has received draft values for the 2014-2015 Performance Based Funding metrics. The validated and finalized results will be presented to the Board of Trustees at the July retreat.

Director of Foundation and External Funding – Ms. Cynthia Reyna

- 1. An Evening with the Stars was a successful event -170 tickets were sold.
- 2. The Annual Donor/Scholar Luncheon will be held on Thursday, April 28th, at 12:00 p.m.
- 3. U.S. Economic Development Assistance Grant proposal request for \$850,000 was submitted for funding of the Advanced Manufacturing Training Center. Re-submitted concept paper through Southwest Arkansas Planning and Development District.
- 4. The Employee Annual Fund Drive will run from April 19th May 3rd.
- 5. Phase II of the Arkansas Natural and Cultural Resources Council (ANCRC) Grant for further renovation and restoration of the W.F. and Estelle McWilliams House and property (Calahan residents) application was submitted and award will be determined in May.
