COMMENTS AND NOTES:

Program Description	The PN program is designed to prepare the successful graduates who pass the NCLEX-PN licensure exam to provide diverse types of nursing care in a variety of health care environments for patients across the lifespan. The SPRING track of the evening program begins in the spring semester and concludes the next May (4 semesters: spring, summer, fall, and spring).
Program Requirements	51 TOTAL Program credit hours. Completion of all remediation requirements; Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.00; All prerequisite courses must be completed with grade of 'C' or better prior to program entry (GPA in prerequisite courses = min. of 2.00); May be enrolled in <u>only two</u> of the three prerequisite courses in the semester that immediately precedes program entry; Students admitted to the program are not allowed to take any non-program courses concurrently while in the program. Application required; Selective admission; Applicants will be selected based on a point system derived from a combination of cumulative GPA, prerequisite GPA, and TEAS scores. TEAS requirements: See https://www.southark.edu/academics/health-science/teas-exam ; TEAS results must be delivered by student to nursing dept. on day of testing; Selected students must pass a criminal background check and drug screen and are required to have all immunizations, vaccinations, testings, & screenings required by clinical facilities. After successful completion of all program courses (grade of 'C' or higher in all program courses), graduates will be eligible to register for the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX). Graduation from the practical nursing program does not automatically enable the graduate to sit for the NCLEX-PN. Eligibility to take the NCLEX-PN is dependent on meeting standards in the Arkansas State Board Nurse Practice Act and rules (or the standards of the Nursing Board in the state for which the graduate intends to apply for licensure). Graduation from the program does not ensure that the graduate will pass the NCLEX-PN licensure exam. Upon successful completion of the NCLEX-PN, the graduate will be a Licensed Practical Nurse (LPN).
