COMMENTS AND NOTES:

After successful completion of all program courses, graduates will be eligible to register for the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX). Graduation from the practical nursing program does not automatically enable the graduate to sit for the NCLEX-PN. Eligibility to take the NCLEX-PN is dependent on meeting standards in the Arkansas State Board Nurse Practice Act and rules (or Nursing Board graduate is applying for licensure to). Graduation from the program does not ensure that the graduate will pass the NCLEX-PN licensure exam. Upon successful completion of the NCLEX-PN, graduate will be a licensed practical nurse.

Program Description	The PN program is designed to prepare the successful graduates who pass the NCLEX-PN licensure exam to provide diverse types of nursing care in a variety of health care environments for patients across the lifespan. The FALL track of the evening program begins in the fall semester and concludes the next December (4 semesters: fall, spring, summer, and fall).
Program Requirements	Program = 51 credit hours total. Completion of all BSTD requirements; Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.00; All prerequisite courses must be completed with grade of 'C' or better prior to program entry (GPA in prerequisite courses = min. of 2.00); May be enrolled in <u>only two</u> of the three prerequisite courses in the semester that immediately precedes program entry; Students admitted to the program are not allowed to take any non-program courses concurrently while in the program. Application required; Selective admission; Applicants will be selected based on a point system derived from a combination of cumulative GPA, prerequisite GPA, and TEAS scores. TEAS must be within one year of application deadline & results must be delivered by student to nursing dept. on day of testing; Minimum TEAS scores: Reading 45, Math 30, Science 30, English 35, and Composite 40; Selected students must pass a criminal background check and drug screen.
