School Enrollment

Individual enrollments were identified from the snapshot file of the data collected via the internal database, Jenzabar, for the listed terms on the 11th day of classes. The student semester credit hours (SSCH) count and full-time enrollment (FTE) presented are based on the corrections provided by the Arkansas Division of Higher Education (ADHE), which can include the removal of undocumented students. Off-schedule classes and total term student semester credit hours have been included in this data. Full-time status is defined by ADHE as a 15 hour or more credit load while the national Integrated Postsecondary Education Data System (IPEDS) uses a 12 hour minimum.

Individual enrollment classifications are defined by ADHE as follows:

- First-time entering undergraduate student: a student entering any college for the first time ever
- First-time entering undergraduate transfer student: an undergraduate student entering the institution for the first time with credit courses attempted or completed at another institution
- Continuing undergraduate student: a student who was previously enrolled at the college during the previous regular academic term and has completed a year’s worth of courses
- High school student: a student who has not received a high school diploma or GED but is enrolled in college-level courses
- Readmitted undergraduate: an undergraduate who has transferred to another college but returned to SouthArk, or a student who has returned to the institution after a time of one year or longer

Chart 1: Fall 2020 Individual Enrollments by Classification

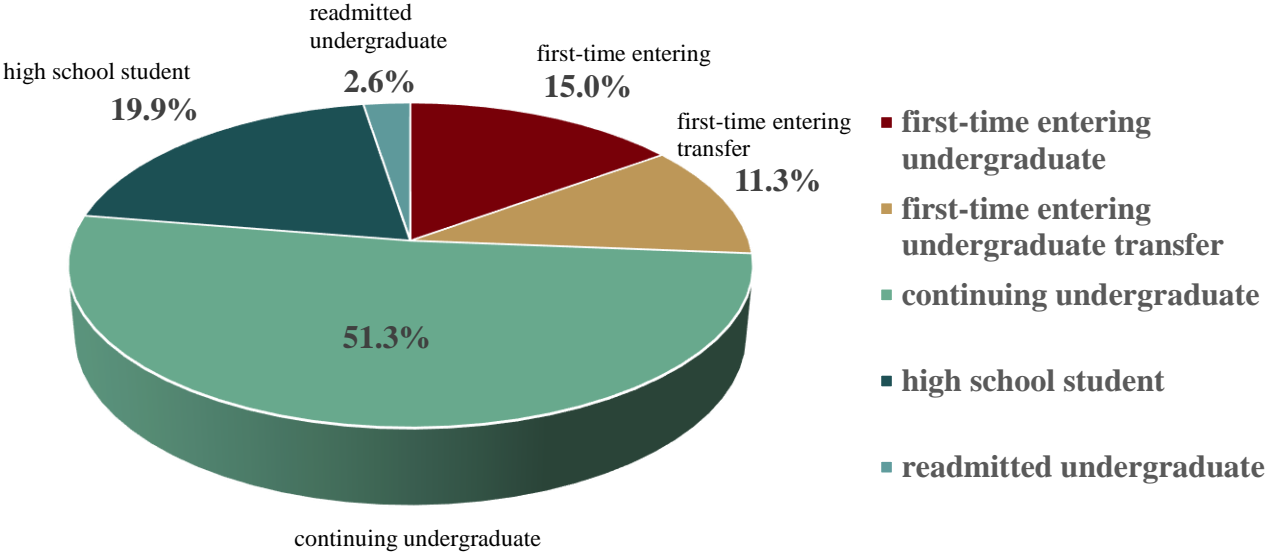
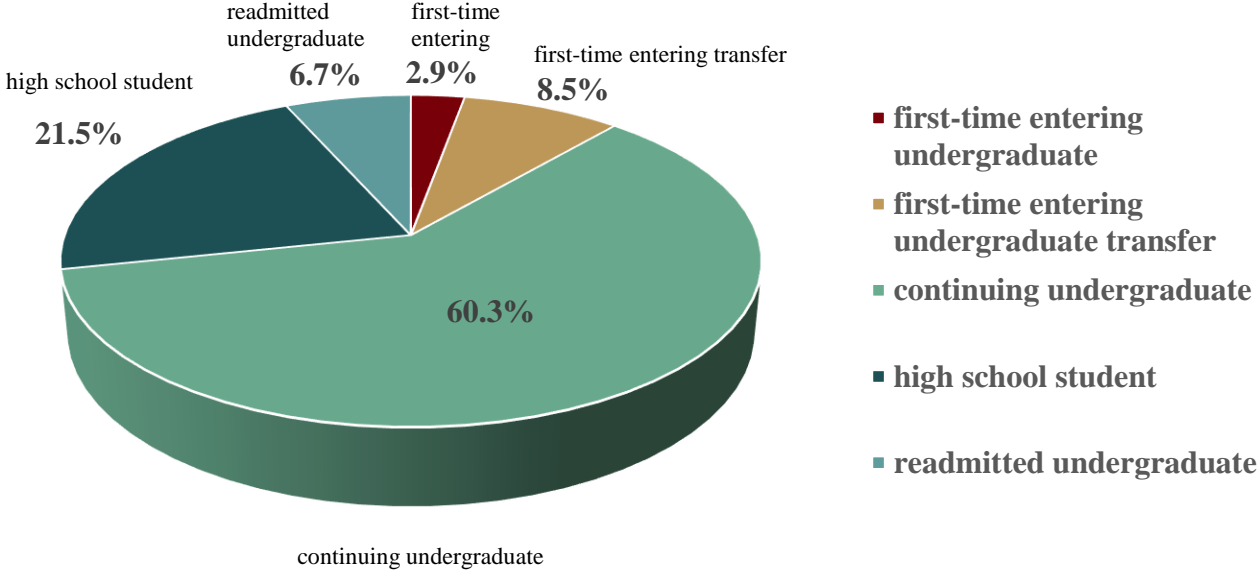


Chart 2: Spring 2021 Individual Enrollments by Classification

Chart 3: Fall 2020 Individual Enrollments by County of Origin

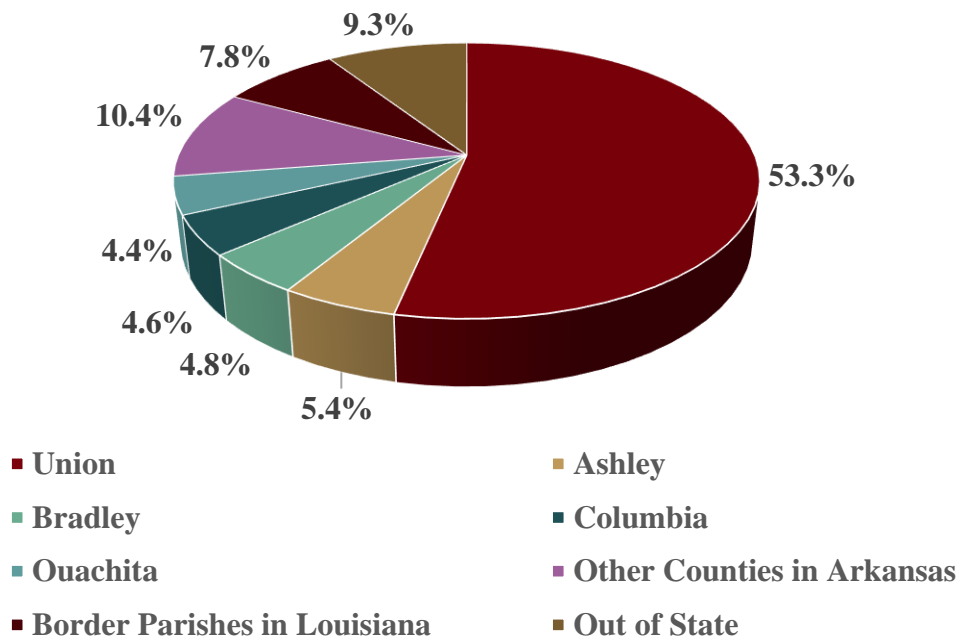

Chart 4: Individual Enrollments by Declared Majors for Fall 2020

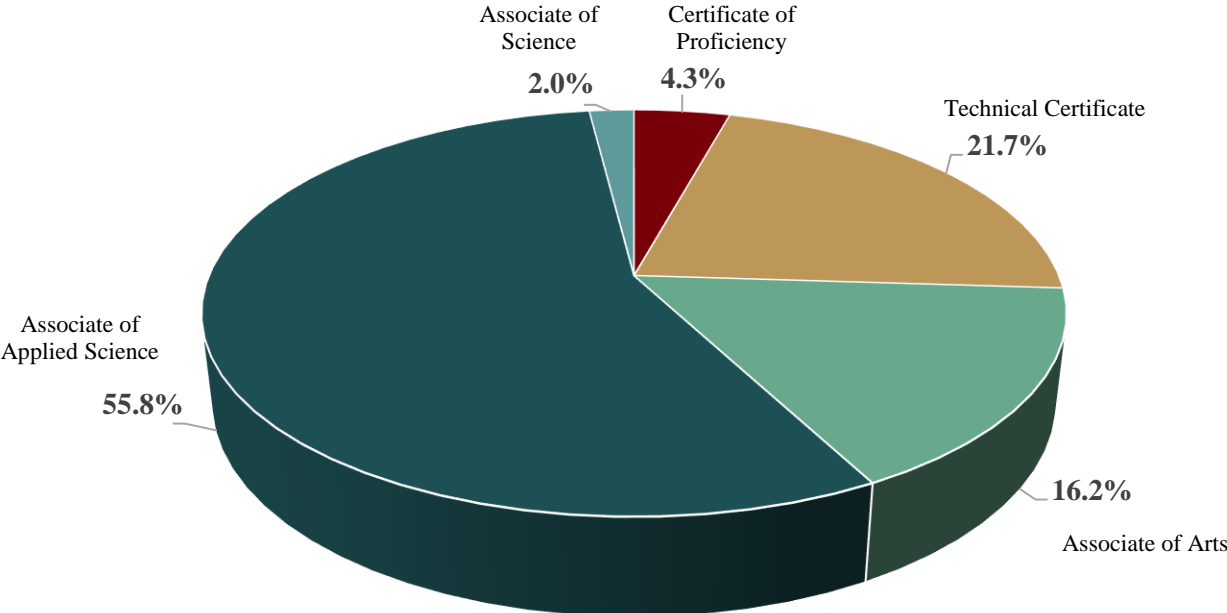


Chart 5: Student Semester Credit Hours and Full-time Enrollments for Fall 2020

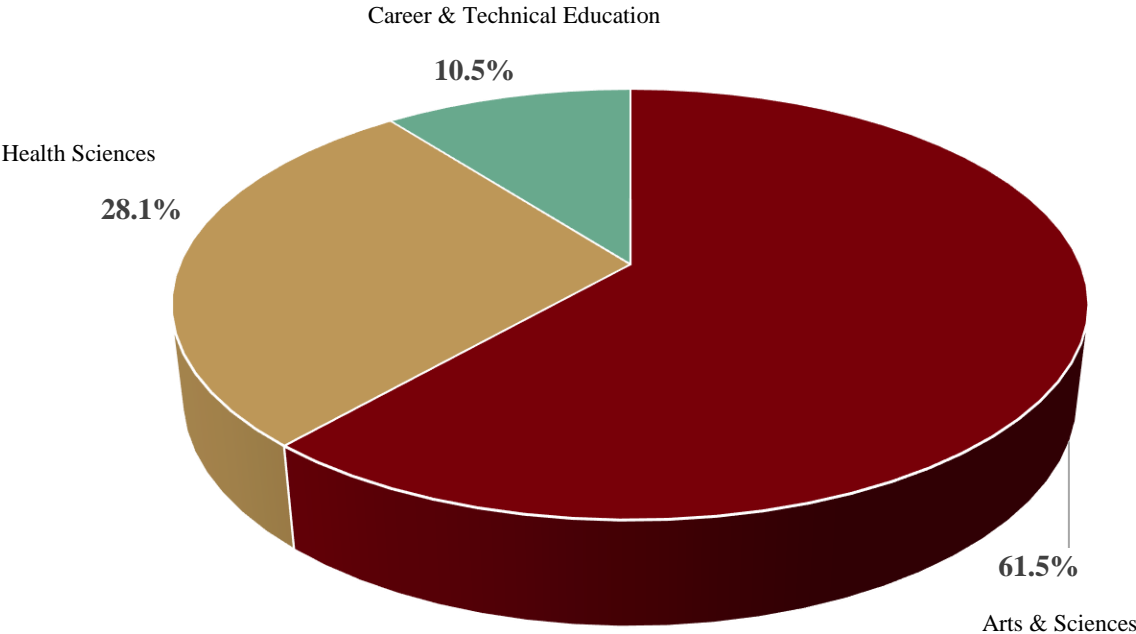

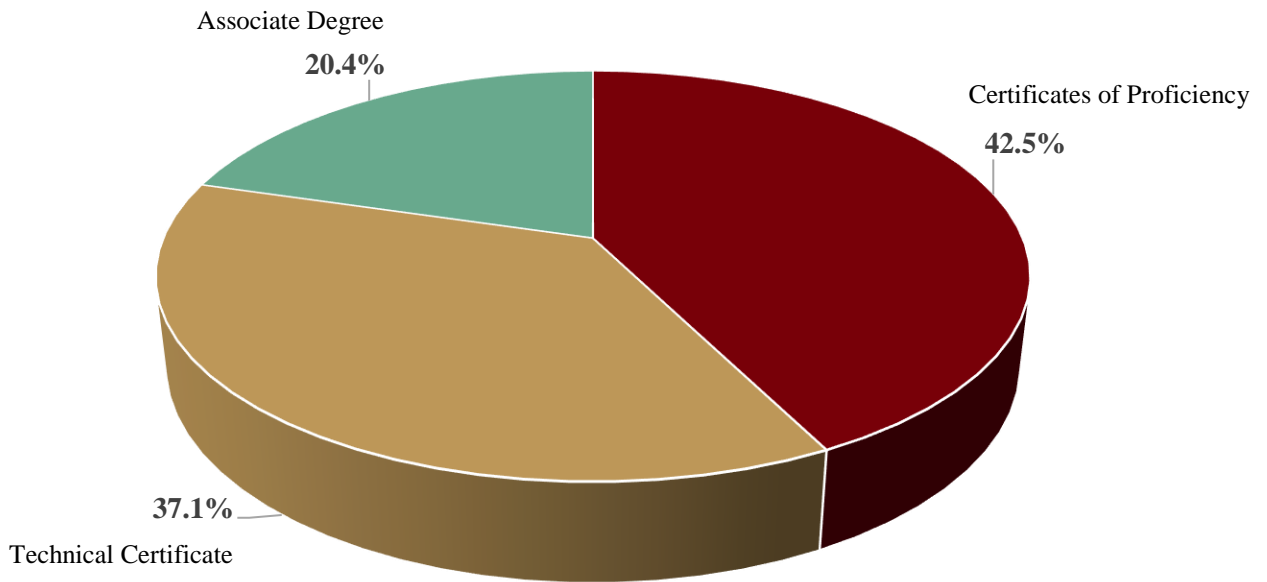
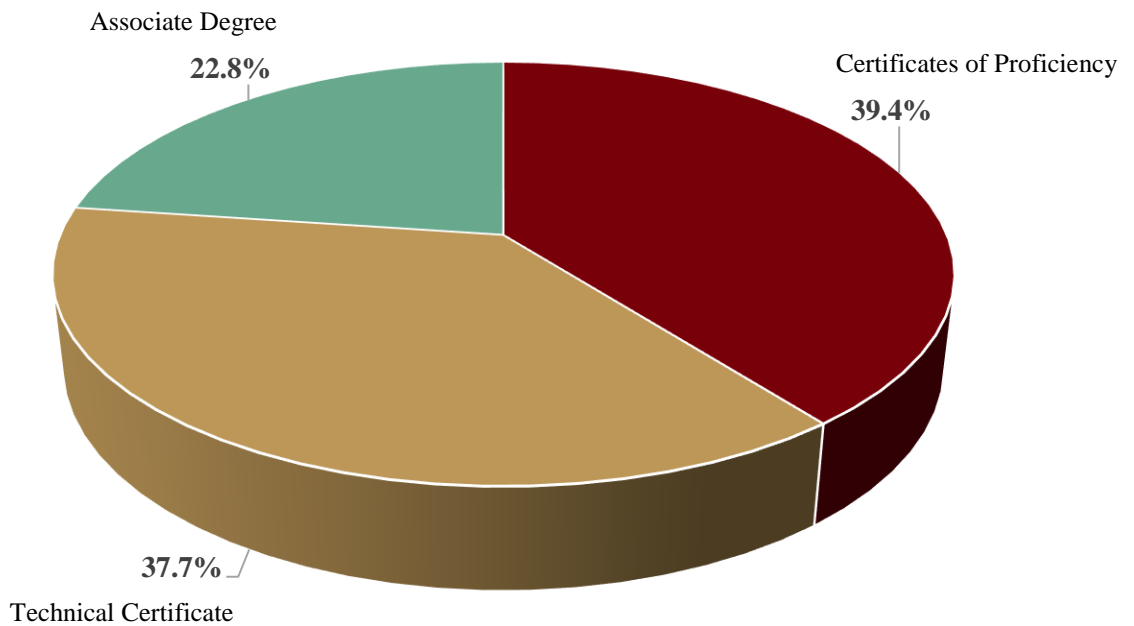


Chart 7: 2020-2021 School Year Degrees and Certificates Awarded by Division

Chart 8: Employment Status as of Fall 2020

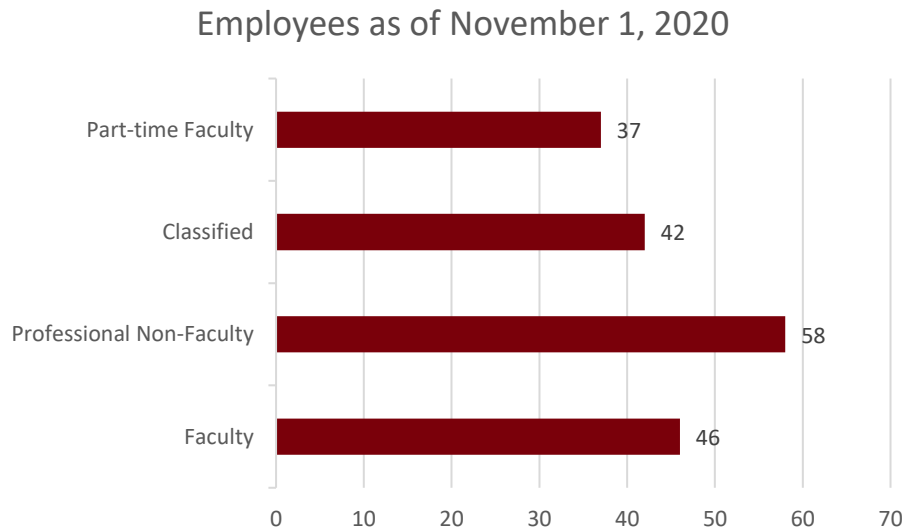

Graduation rates of full-time, first-time, degree/certificate-seeking undergraduates within normal time, and 150% and 200% of normal time to completion: 2015 cohort

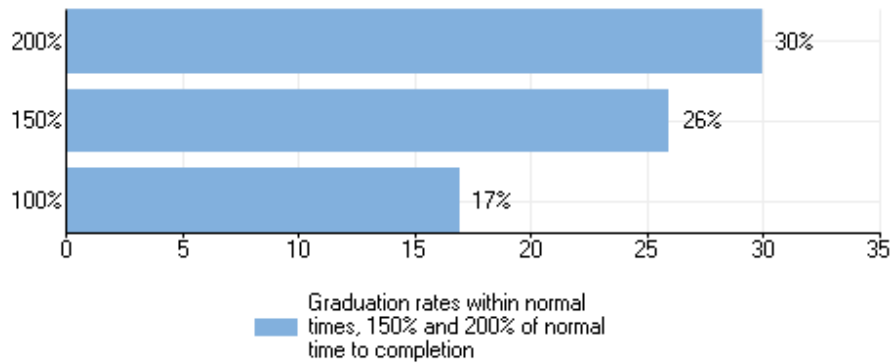
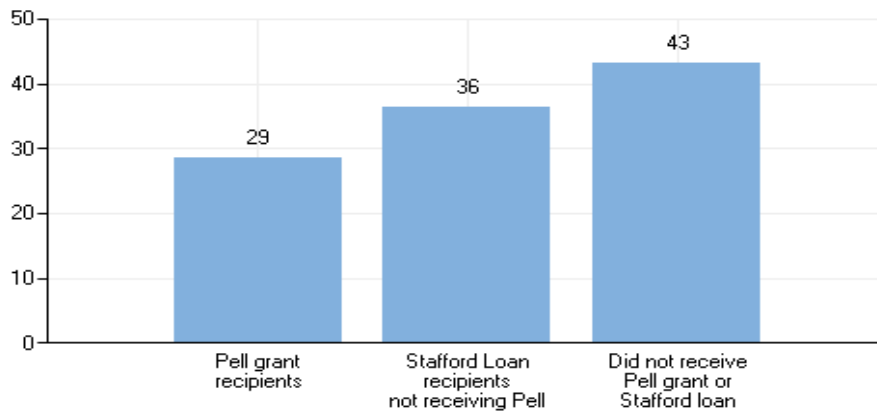


Chart 10: Graduation Rates within 150% of Time to Completion by Financial Aid type (IPEDS), 2016 cohort

Chart A1: Population by County in the SouthArk Region

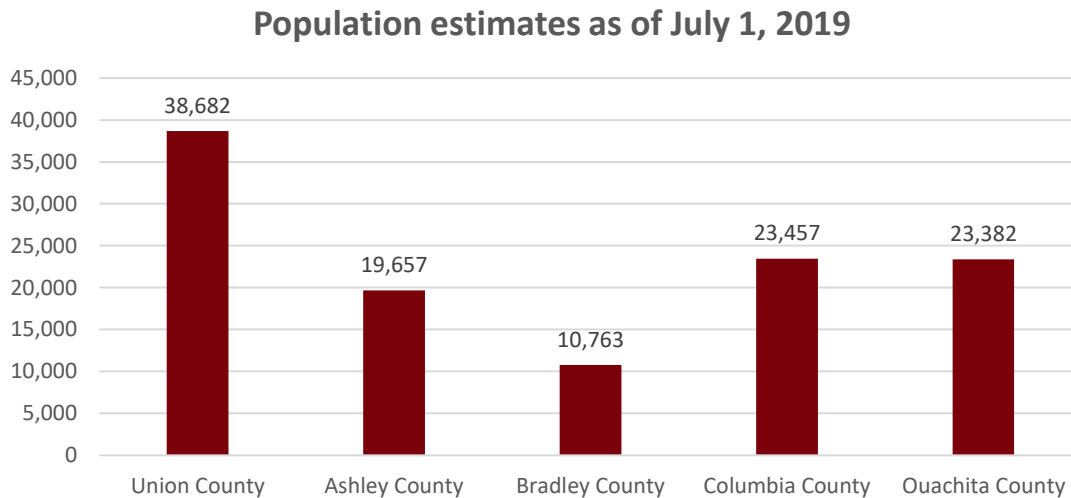
